JUDGES BIOGRAPHIES

Helen Chao-Casano, Piano

Helen Chao-Casano, NCTM is the Director of Punahou Music School and serves on the piano faculty at Punahou Music School. She holds a Bachelor's degree in Music Education and Performance from the Crane School of Music, Potsdam College and a Master's degree in Piano Performance and Pedagogy from Northwestern University. She completed additional performance studies at the St. Petersburg Piano Institute at the St. Petersburg Conservatory in Russia. Her main teachers include Frank logha, David Kaiserman, Frances Larimer and Elena Shishko. An experienced teacher, Chao-Casano has taught at Northwestern University Music Academy, DePaul University, Brigham Young University – Hawai'i and University of Hawai'i at Mānoa. Chao-Casano was named HMTA Teacher of the Year (2007) and was also recognized as an MTNA Foundation Fellow. She was selected as a Community Arts Education Leadership Institute Fellow, a leadership development program offered by the National Guild for Community Arts Education. An active member of the music community, Chao-Casano has served on the executive boards of the Music Teachers National Association, the Hawai'i Music Teachers Association, the Honolulu Piano Teachers Association, and the Honolulu Chamber Music Series. Chao-Casano currently serves as the MTNA National Certification Commission Chair.

Monica Chung, Piano

Monica Chung is a concert pianist, producer, music director, and teacher. Her solo debut with the North Carolina Piedmont Triad Symphony Orchestra was at age 10 as a result of winning 1st prize in the Competition. She has appeared as soloist with orchestras in London, Hungary, New York, and St. Petersburg in Russia under the baton of the late Sviatoslav Luther. Monica is founder of the series A Night of Chamber Music with Ensemble Henrietta. As music director, Monica enjoyed Hawai'i Children's Theatre After Dark alumni production of the controversial show *Spring Awakening*, Kaua'i Community Players production of *Sweeney Todd*, *Nice Work If You Can Get It* for Kaua'i Performing Arts Center, and most recently the Hogfish Production of the Opera *CarmXn*. She is indebted to her teachers Pavlina Dokovska, Alexander Slobodyanik, Vladimir Feltsman, Olegna Fuschi, and Eric Larsen. Monica served on piano faculty at the historical NYC landmark Greenwich House Music School, and Bergen Academy of Music & Art.

She is Music Lecturer at Kaua'i Community College, and maintains a private studio of pianists and composers. She is Director for the Kaua'i Concert Association, and enjoying her term as President of the Hawai'i Music Teachers Association.

Karen Fujimoto, Cello

Karen Fujimoto has been an active performer in Hawai'i since 1985, when she joined the Honolulu Symphony Orchestra. She is currently a member of the Hawai'i Symphony Orchestra, and has performed with Hawai'i Opera Theatre, Hawai'i Pops Orchestra, Bach Chamber Orchestra, Early Music Hawai'i. Chamber Music Hawai'i, and Pacific International Concert Artists. She began her cello studies in Honolulu with Dr. Allen Trubitt, and received her Bachelor of Music degree in cello performance from the San Francisco Conservatory of Music, where her primary teachers were Irene Sharp and Bonnie Hampton. Karen has also studied chamber music performance with Joseph Fuchs.

Monika Haar, Piano

Born and raised in Hawai'i, Monika Haar studied piano with Peter Coraggio at the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa since she was nine years old. She won the advanced division of the Mozart Competition two years in a row, and performed with the Hawai'i Symphony Orchestra at age sixteen. Monika attended the Kodály Institute of Music in Hungary, where she was the youngest participant at age fourteen. The following year, she was awarded first runner-up in an international concerto competition at the New Orleans Piano Institute. Since then, Monika directed and performed with InnoVox, a contemporary chamber ensemble in New York City. InnoVox was featured nationally at the Chamber Music America Showcase Concert in Times Square, and was a finalist at the Arriaga Chamber Music Competition in 2014. Monika spent several years training with Taubman Method specialist, Robert Durso, and attended the Golandsky Institute Summer Symposium at Princeton University. This allowed Monika to understand proper alignment and usage of the body in order to cure and avoid repetitive stress injuries. Monika attended the Oberlin Conservatory of Music and the Aaron Copland School of Music, where she studied with Robert Shannon, Michael Lipsey, and Ursula Oppens.

Claire Hazzard, Violin

Born and raised in Honolulu, Claire Sakai Hazzard is a graduate of Roosevelt High School and the University of Hawai'i. During her teenage years, she was a member of the Hawai'i Youth Symphony and the University of Hawai'i Symphony, and served as concertmaster of both ensembles. After receiving her B.A. cum laude in psychology, she played second violin in the University of Hawai'i Faculty String Quartet. She joined the Honolulu Symphony (now the Hawai'i Symphony Orchestra) in 1975 and eventually performed as Associate Concertmaster for decades until 2022 when she retired from that position.

A founding member of the Galliard String Quartet, Claire would enjoy being its first violinist for almost thirty years. She also played with various festivals – Peter Britt, Kapalua, and Grand Teton music festivals. Private teaching, coaching chamber music at various local institutions, as well as freelancing, round out Claire's music experience. An advocate of music, she well knows the power of this gift which wonderfully encourages creativity and expression.

Susan McGinn, Flute

Susan McGinn is the principal flutist of the Hawai'i Symphony Orchestra, and member of the Spring Wind Quintet of the Chamber Music of Hawai'i. She has served as a performer, teacher, clinician and judge for many institutions, festivals and groups throughout North America and Europe.

A native of Detroit, Michigan, she studied with some of the world's most respected flutists at several major universities in the United States and England. She has been awarded positions in major music festivals throughout the world where she has served as soloist, chamber, and orchestral musician. These experiences have provided Susan with the opportunity to perform with some of the world's most renowned artists and conductors.

Shima Rossitto, Flute

Shima Rossitto is a flutist who has spent the past 10 years performing with the Hawai'i Symphony Orchestra and the Royal Hawaiian Band. She performs with various chamber groups and ensembles and has performed as a guest soloist at multiple concerts in the United States and Japan.

A native of Japan, Shima earned her bachelors in flute performance and education at Doshisha University in Kyoto where she studied under the Kyoto Symphony principal flutist Nobutaka Shimizu. She later received her masters in flute performance from Carnegie Mellon University in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, where she studied under former New York Symphony principal flutist Jeanne Baxtresser. As a formally trained instructor, Shima has a passion for building greatness in the next generation of flutists. She has visited and performed for schools on Oahu, Maui, and across Japan including multiple remote islands to teach local children the joys of music.

Sabrina Saiki-Mita, Flute

Sabrina Saiki-Mita received a Bachelor of Music degree from the University of Hawai'i at Manoa as a student of Jean Harling, and a Master of Music degree from the University of North Texas, where she studied with Mary Karen Clardy. Ms Saiki-Mita has taught privately since 1990 and currently teaches at the University of Hawai'i at Manoa and the Punahou Music School. Aside from teaching, Ms. Saiki-Mita performs with her flute and guitar duo, Reverie, part-time with the Royal Hawaiian Band, and also as a freelance musician. She has adjudicated for middle and high school Solo and Ensemble festivals in Oahu and North Texas, and the MTNA Southwest Division Competition in Hawai'i.

Ms. Saiki-Mita is in demand as a clinician and adjudicator throughout Oahu. She has produced masterclasses and events in Hawai'i with Mary Karen Clardy, Susan Glaser, Nora Lee Garcia, Masahide Kurita, Cathy Peterson, Jim Phelan, Brian Luce, Tadeu Coelho, and Sir James and Lady Jeanne Galway.

Anna Womack, Viola

A member of the Hawai'i Symphony Orchestra and University of Hawai'i at Mānoa faculty since 1995, violist Anna Womack concertizes frequently with various chamber groups and is a core performer with Pacific International Concert Artists. She has performed as soloist with the University of Hawai'i Chamber Orchestra and the Lutheran Church of Honolulu's Bach Chamber Orchestra, and, as a proponent of new music, has premiered numerous chamber solo works. She is active as an educator, maintaining a private teaching studio in Hawai'i Kai, and serving as a clinician at school music programs. Anna holds a bachelor's degree in philosophy from Furman University and a master's degree in viola from Northwestern University. When not teaching, rehearsing, or practicing, she can be found competing in local tennis tournaments or hiking Hawaii's trails with her husband, composer Donald Reid Womack, and their two sons.
